RESOLUTION OF APPRECIATION TO JACK McLAUGHLIN

For his service as Superintendent of the Berkeley Unified School District 1994-2001

WHEREAS, Dr. Jack W. McLaughlin, Jr. has served Berkeley Unified School District students and staff since 1994; and

WHEREAS, Jack's office door is always open, which makes him one of the most approachable and available administrators we have ever worked with; and

WHEREAS, Jack's strong leadership, his ability to take on challenging issues and solve difficult problems, his ability to mobilize, build support and achieve consensus among different groups, his passion for students, and his willingness to become intimately involved in the Berkeley community gave the District stability and allowed us to accomplish many milestones such as: implementing grade reconfiguration; successfully integrating elementary schools through the new student assignment/desegregation program; increasing student population by nearly 2,000, necessitating the opening of a new elementary school (Franklin); implementing full scale Class Size Reduction; developing and implementing an Early Literacy Plan; improving student achievement at all grade levels; six California Distinguished Schools and two Excellence in Arts Education awards; obtaining federal funding and implementing four new magnet school programs; converting the continuation school to an alternative high school; implementing a rigorous promotion / retention policy; designing an innovative extended year program for students at risk; implemented an extended day program for additional academic student support; building five new school buildings and renovating all elementary schools and three high school buildings; successfully passing a new bond measure and special tax to continue the building and maintenance program; improving the salary scale of Berkeley teachers; and implementing a classroom technology program; and

WHEREAS, Jack spearheaded many visionary programs such as: after school and integrated social service programs; a groundbreaking Food Policy and garden program; Columbus School Capital Campaign; and founding member of the Minority Student Achievement Network; and

WHEREAS, Jack courageously pursued lawsuits that fought the implementation of Proposition 227 and that kept English test scores from impacting the academic standing of non English speaking students; and

WHEREAS, Jack was one of the youngest California educators to become a superintendent 26 years ago and worked in several districts throughout the state of California before accepting the Berkeley position in 1994 and was named the California Superintendent of the year in 1998; and

WHEREAS, Jack has decided to retire from the Berkeley Unified School District and assume the position of Nevad State Superintendent of Public Instruction.

THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the Board of Directors of the Berkeley Unified School District wishes to thank Jack for his many years of service to Berkeley students and staff and wishes him much success as the Nevada State Superintendent of Public Instruction.
